MINISTRY DURING 2016:

<u>Kenya and Serbia</u> — March 28–April 20 (Arranged consecutively to meet the needs of our ministry partners)

- Kenya: (1) Met with Sunday school and ministry leaders at Karen Community Church to talk about disability ministry. (2) Spoke at a meeting of parents at Little Helping Hands School at the launch of a Parent Support Group. (3) Conducted 4-day seminar with Christian school teachers of "emerging disabilities and inclusive education." (4) Preached at Karen Community Church. (5) Sponsored a "reunion" with families from the 2015 family retreat.
- 2. Serbia: HUB Bible School teaching: To first year students, taught Acts 16–28. To the second year students, taught "Beyond Suffering" and "Spiritual Warfare." Preached in two churches.

Minnesota — June 3–9

1. Presentation at Calvary Baptist Church, Roseville, MN (our commissioning and sponsoring church) to give a ministry impact report. Also provided opportunity for "friend/fund raising" which resulted in several contributions from previously unknown people for the 2016 Kenya family retreat.

Kenya — August 3–16

- 1. Two-day disability ministry training at Acorn Special Tutorials School, the school run by our ministry partner in Kenya, Eva Nyoike.
- 2. One day of training for volunteers who would be working with children at the family retreat.
- 3. Speaking with the families (parents) at the family retreat. Theme taken from Psalm 29:11 "The Lord gives strength to his people' the Lord blesses his people with peace."

<u>Ukraine</u> – October 19–31

- 1. Zolotonosha: 2-day conference on preaching for 26 pastors. My topic was "Inclusive Gospel—Inclusive Preaching."
- 2. Chepkiavka: 3-day conference for 30 young pastors on "The Tests and Temptations of Pastors." My session focused on the tests of popularity and praise, and prosperity and possessions.
- Cherkassy: 2-day church leadership conference for about 290 delegates on the spiritual development of a leader. My focus was following Jesus' lead in ministry to people with disabilities.
- 4. Informal meetings with residents of a rehabilitation center run by the Baptist Union, and with the new director of the youth center which is developing a retreat site for families dealing with disability.
- 5. Preaching in two churches in Zolotonosha.

Kenya — November 25–December 6

- 1. Preaching at Kings Ambassador Church in the Kangemi area of Nairobi, and presenting a halfday seminar on engaging in disability ministry. Preaching at Karen Community Church,.
- 2. A two-day training staff of Acorn Special Tutorials on special education as ministry.
- 3. Gathering of the retreat families for another "reunion" at Karen Community Church.

OTHER MINISTRY-RELATED ACTIVITY:

- 1. In Cherkassy, Ukraine: meeting with the director and chief editor of Smirna Publishing House in Cherkassy regarding the formal production of a Russian language version of *Reaching Out and Bringing In: Ministry to and with Persons with Disabilities*. The initial printing: 500 copies to be used in Ukraine and Belarus. Arrangements for this were made through the foreign projects coordinator of READ Ministries (Resources for Evangelism and Discipleship), based in Minnesota-based ministry.
 - a. At the Cherkassy conference, about 500 copies of the original translation, photocopied and supplied by Smirna Publishing House, were made available.
- 2. In Seoul, Korea, a Korean translation of *Reaching Out and Bringing In* was published by Christian Literature center for use at Korea Nazareth University.
- 3. Completion of program of studies for the Doctor of Biblical Studies degree through Master's International University of Divinity, Evansville, IN.
- 4. Ongoing association with Master's International University of Divinity as Program Developer and Director for the M.A. Certificate in Disabilities Ministry.
